This qualification reflects the role of workers participating in the design, implementation and evaluation of leisure and health activities and programs for clients in one or more sector areas. Workers may be in residential facilities and/or in community agencies and day centres, completing specialised tasks and functions in relation to leisure and health. While workers are responsible for their own outputs, work is carried out under direct or indirect supervision within defined organisation guidelines.

To achieve this qualification, the candidate must complete at least 120 hours of work placement as detailed in the assessment requirements of the unit of competency.

Must be over the age of 17  
 Must complete all assessment requirements

Able to obtain all required clearances

Have basic to intermediate computer skills

Complete all required enrolment processes including:

Successfully completing FFS Language, Literacy and Numeracy test (Fee for Service Students)

Successfully completing Upfront Assessment of Need process including Language, Literacy and Numeracy test (Students who are eligible for subsidised funding/Job Trainer)
